OUR IMPACT IN THE YOUNG ADULT COMMUNITY

Imagine being told that a family member has stage four cancer and within 3 weeks they are gone; truncating a long-term intimate relationship; experiencing anxiety associated with adjusting to a new environment and struggling in university; depressed, feeling sad, hopeless, unmotivated and exhibiting symptoms of suicidal ideation, thinking that is a solution to all the problems; questioning one's faith and entertaining the thought that God is not listening to your prayers or is mad at you for past mistakes.

These are not made-up stories, these are the lived experiences students have shared with me during counselling this year. Students have been able to seek and receive help and in one case this year, we are grateful that a student who was in a desperate place, contemplating suicide was provided with resources around safety and reminded of their value and reason for living.

Through counselling services to young adults, together as a church we are not only partnering to meet physical needs, but are now able to offer services to meet emotional needs with the hope of ultimately meeting spiritual needs.

Discipleship Stories

In January of 2019, we launched a new discipleship initiative out of the sermon series, *Discipleshift*. There were 137 people signed up to either be discipled or to be a disciple-maker. We paired them up and sent them off. Many of those pairs are still on-going and the feedback has been exciting. Here is a story from those who have participated in the discipleship initiative:

"My discipleship partner and I agreed to go for six months and then evaluate how we felt. Both of us want to continue. My partner said the experience has been transformational for him. He came into it wanting to 'fix' his prayer life and he said our conversations morphed into deepening our relationship with God. He is very pleased, and a side benefit is that his prayer life is better and he is discerning

the Holy Spirit's voice and direction. I came into this with no idea what we'd be doing, and I had no program to follow, no preconceived ideas about what to do. I just went week by week based on what happened in our time together and asked the Spirit what to do next. In the fall, we want to explore together learning to live life following the Spirit's guidance. This has been a great experience for both of us."
